

IN 2021, CHINA INTRODUCED A LAW UNDER XI JINPING'S CAMPAIGN CRIMINALIZING INSULTS TO REVOLUTIONARY "HEROES AND MARTYRS," WITH PENALTIES OF UP TO THREE YEARS IN PRISON—A CRACKDOWN THAT CAME LONG AFTER MOST OF GAO ZHEN'S WORK WAS CREATED.
